Academic Session






On the 21st and 23 of July, Inter House Hindi Debate Competition was conducted.



All the citizens were therefore ordered to get these specific notes replaced with the legalized currency from their respective banks as a part of the demonetization. People were encouraged to use their bank deposits rather than cash for their transactions. More digital transfers started taking place and bank-to-bank transfers through the internet or mobile phones, cheques, Atm cards, credit cards, and swipe machines reduced the requirement for cash which indeed brought corruption under control.

The shape of the Earth is Geoid (similar to an orange). It moves on an imaginary axis and has a tilt of 231/2. It rotates with a velocity of 29.8 km/sec. The total surface area is 511 million km(square). It has a diameter of 12756 km. The minimum distance of the Earth from the Sun is 147.9 million km and this distance is called Perihelion and the maximum distance is 152.1 million which is called Aphelion.

The new policy replaces the previous National Policy on Education, 1986, The policy is a comprehensive framework for elementary education to higher education as well as vocational training in both rural and urban India and aims to transform the education system by 2030. From the Gurukuls to Modern and advanced (technical) learning in India. India being a developing nation has to take certain measures from time to time that can upgrade the standard of education in India to an extent that the education can become skill-based learning. It focuses on making the youth more capable and more independent and Indians can make the best use of manpower available to it.

DRAWBACKS

There are certain loopholes and drawbacks which bring about hurdles and intervention in the efficient working of the development programs. Corruption in the government system of education is the major cause. Employment of sub-standard teachers, poor infrastructure and inferior accessories, and lack of technical assistance and equipment don't generally allow the welfare programs to run effectively. Also what is written and sanctioned in the books is hardly implemented in actuality. The impact of western civilization is another big drawback. The theoretical aspect of learning is given more relevance and no efforts are made to the practical application of the knowledge gained which makes it a deficit system.

MEASURES

Government schools and institutions should be inspected by certain authorized officials to properly evaluate the quality of education imparted to children.

The students should be provided with all the books and other accessories required during the learning process. The syllabus should be revised from time to time to make the learning skill-based and practical. The eligibility of the teachers needs to be taken care of before they are recruited and also time to time reporting on the performance of the learners can really improve the standard of education imparted in government schools.



India's first indigenous aircraft carrier Indian Naval Ship(INS-Vikrant), which Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi commissioned to the Indian Navy at Cochin Shipyard Limited (CSL) on September 2, 2022, is a major milestone in our maritime History, showcasing the country's growing prowess and of summarizing the importance of the INS Vikrant for the country. The Prime Minister exclaimed that Vikrant is special as it is not just a warship but a very powerful symbol of India's power and strength. It is huge and massive and it represents how India has been able to categorize itself as one of the most influential countries of the world as it now has the capacity to build, manufacture and design an aircraft carrier like the UK, Russia, China, US, and France.

INS Vikrant, the largest warship which is manufactured in India is 262 m long and 62 meters wide. It has a maximum speed of 28 knots per hour. It will be India's second-largest aircraft carrier after INS-Vikramaditya which was built on a Russian platform. Initially, the warship will carry MIG fighter jets and some helicopters. INS-Vikrant has the capacity to accommodate 1600 crew members and 30 aircraft on board. It is equipped with machines that can make 3000 chappatis in an hour. The warship is equipped with a 16-bed hospital, 250 tankers of fuel, and 2400 compartments. It has specialized cabins to accommodate women officers and sailors.






